1. What do you think of the proposed minimum feed-in tariff for 2020-21?

Consumers were advised that having solar would reduce our electricity charges as we would be assisting the electricity suppliers by reducing the load on their network and that we would be compensated accordingly. Our electricity charges are increasing and the rebate offered is decreasing. This reduces the incentive to have a solar system and the payback time on installation increases. If these companies want the consumer to help them reduce their costs, the consumer should be better compensated for doing so.
