Report shows Victorians missed out on millions of dollars in energy bill savings last financial year

Victorian households could have saved an estimated \$191 million on electricity bills and \$89 million on gas bills last financial year if they had been on their retailer's best offer, according to data from our latest <u>Victorian Energy Market Report</u>.

The report provides analysis of prices and competition in Victorian retail energy markets, key compliance and enforcement activities, data on customers experiencing payment difficulties, disconnections, and market entry and exits over the reporting period April to June 2023.

Consultation opens for revocation of the Electricity System Code

We have published a <u>draft decision for</u> <u>consultation, proposing to revoke the</u> <u>Electricity System Code</u>. Established in 2000, the code contains obligations relating to Victorian electricity transmission and distribution businesses.

The proposed revocation of the code is the latest in our review of our energy codes. We propose to revoke the Electricity System Code as our review indicates that obligations in the code have been largely superseded by the national energy framework – the National Electricity Rules and National Electricity Law, which are administered by the Australian Energy Market Operator (AEMO) and the Australian Energy Regulator (AER).

EWOV & ESC Family Violence Leaders Forum

Over 100 leaders from the water, energy and community sectors joined Energy and Water Ombudsman (Victoria) Catherine Wolthuizen and Essential Services Commission chairperson Kate Symons for the online family violence leaders forum on Tuesday 29 August.

New performance report released on the Victorian Energy Upgrades program

The Victorian Energy Upgrades program is the largest energy efficiency program in Australia, providing Victorians access to discounted energy-saving products and activities.

Our 2022 Performance Report released last week shows that over 535,000 Victorian households and businesses benefitted from energy efficient upgrades through the Victorian Energy Upgrades program in 2022, which is expected to save over 7.8 million tonnes of greenhouse gas emissions.
