Our role in energy licensing

A person who wants to engage in the activity of transmitting electricity in Victoria is required to hold a licence granted by the Essential Services Commission (commission).

A decision whether to grant or refuse a licence application, must be made in accordance with the relevant provisions of the *Electricity Industry Act 2000* and the *Essential Services Commission Act 2001*. This includes the requirement to have regard to the commission objective of promoting the long-term interests of Victorian consumers with respect to the price, quality and reliability of essential services

How we assess licence applications

We may only grant a licence if we are satisfied that:

- The applicant has the technical capacity to comply with the conditions of the licence, including that it has the capacity to operate and manage the business, comply with licence conditions and comply with relevant regulatory obligations.
- The applicant is financially viable (where applicable).
- The applicant is a 'fit and proper' person to hold a licence in Victoria.
